PREAMBLE

St Cecily's English Medium Higher Primary School, Udupi, started by the Apostolic Carmel Sisters in 1959, is a Minority Educational Institution as per the Constitutions of India, Article No. 30 (1). The school was granted Permanent Recognition by the Department of Education Government of Karnataka, in 1965 from Standard I to VII.

The Apostolic Carmel Congregation was founded by Venerable Mother Veronica of the Passion (1823 – 1906) in Bayonne, France, in 1868 and was established at St Ann's campus in Mangalore in 1870 with its main thrust, the development of women in India, as persons imbued with deep faith in God and in themselves by providing sound Catholic Education. Over the past 152 years of its existence the Institute has expanded with a large number of educational establishments in India, Sri Lanka, Middle East, Pakistan and East Africa.

St Cecilia, the patroness of our school, was born in Rome, towards the close of the Second Century, while Alexander Severus was the Emperor. As a young girl her talent for music was highly remarkable. She was a Patrician, but was brought up as a Christian. From her early age she was determined to remain a maiden for the love of God. She used to fast and perform all kinds of penances and charitable works. But her parents had other designs for her, so gave her in marriage to a young Patrician, Valerian by name.

When Cecilia was taken before the Governor for her refusal to obey his orders she was threatened with a torturous death. She answered, "Do you not know that I am the bride of my Lord Jesus Christ?" The death planned for her was by suffocation and she remained a day and a night immersed in boiling water. When she was found unharmed she was struck by an axe in the head and breast. She lay bleeding for three days praying and exhorting all who visited her.

It is said that when Cecilia was kept in the boiling water for a day and a night she spent this day on earth praising God. Her constant prayer was 'Let my life be a song of praise.'

St Cecilia as the Patron Saint of our School is a model of all that is pure and beautiful to the young pupils of St Cecily's. We have made her motto, **'Let my Life be a Song of Praise'** as our Motto, too, in order that the students may be inspired to **choose the hard right against the easy wrong** in times of conflicts and temptations to yield to the allurements of this world. We want their life to be joyful in spite of all the hardships of life.

Fee structure and Payments: St Cecily's English Medium Hr Pry School is a self-financing School, with no grants from the State or Central Governments. The fee structure is to meet the developmental and recurring expenditure, the major one being salaries of the Staff. Salaries, developmental activities and the mounting maintenance costs require substantial sum of money. Obviously fee raise on a yearly basis to match the current salaries and other costs is inevitable. The Tuition fees can be paid in full at the beginning of the academic year or in 4 instalments:

1st instalment : by 5th June 2022.

2nd instalment : by 15th July 2022.

3rd Instalment : by 2nd October 2022.

4th Instalment : by 20th December 2022.

RULES FOR ADMISSION

1. Only those who have completed 5years 10 months on 30th May are eligible to be admitted to Standard I.
2. Every candidate for admission and withdrawal must be introduced by a letter or in person to the Principal, by one who is responsible for her/him.

3. Pupils coming from other Primary Schools should produce the 'Transfer Certificate' issued by the Head of the School concerned, with the counter signature of the inspecting officer of the place.
4. Admission will ordinarily be closed within 8 days after the re-opening date.
5. Applications for admission should be made in the prescribed form, which can be obtained from the school office/ school website and should be submitted along with the Transfer Certificate from the school last attended. Every pupil on admission shall pay the prescribed fees.
6. Pupils coming from schools outside Karnataka State will be admitted on production of Transfer Certificates duly countersigned by the Inspecting Officers in charge of the Institutions in strict conformity with the table of parity of standards issued by the Department.
7. The Application for Admission must be signed by the father or mother, or in their absence, by a guardian who has been authorized by the parent to do so. This letter of authorization must be filled with the admission form.
8. In the case of admission of pupils coming from Primary Schools, the name and the date of birth as furnished in the Transfer Certificate will be taken as correct. In the case of pupils to be newly admitted, the correct date of birth should be furnished in the application for admission and necessary Documentary Evidence must also be produced.
9. Students belonging to S.C./S.T. should submit a Xerox copy of the Caste Certificate at the time of admission.
10. No alteration in the date of birth will be made without the proper documents submitted to the office.
11. School leaving Certificate will be given only to those who have settled all their dues. Application for school leaving certificate should be made in writing by the parent. A fee of Rs. 200/- is charged for issuing a School Leaving Certificate and Rs. 50/- for any extract from the school's General Register.
12. Special attention must be paid to enter correctly the name and date of birth of the child, caste and the Parents' names. Subsequent changes in the date of birth or name will not be permitted later.

FOR PARENTS

Please note: We require at least three days for processing applications for Certificates, Concession Forms and other Documents. You are, therefore, requested to apply for them well in advance to avoid disappointment.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

1. **Pupils who come to school before 8:35 a.m should sit in their respective classes and spend the time in useful study. No pupil should be found loitering or idling away during the study hour.**

Pupils are expected to be on time for their classes. Late-comers will be marked absent. Habitual late coming should be avoided.

2. On the teacher's arrival in the classroom, the pupils must rise and remain standing till they have prayed and salute the teacher and take their seats.
3. **No pupil is allowed to leave the school during the school hours without the permission of the Headmistress.** Parents should provide a written request asking permission even for noon meals. The School authorities will take action on those students who does not abide by this.
4. a) Punctual and regular attendance is insisted upon. Leave of absence from School even for a few periods for attending marriages, funerals etc., must be applied for previously, in the form supplied in the calendar. The general terms of excuse, 'for some business', 'for some ceremony', 'out of station', are not accepted.
b) When a pupil, has been absent from school without leave for some reason not foreseen, e.g. illness, she must, on returning to school, bring an excuse note from her parent or guardian in the Form supplied in the calendar. Should the absence exceed three days, notice must be forwarded to the Principal.
c) Every student should have her own calendar and bring it to school daily.
d) The students who absent themselves from Semester Examinations will be viewed seriously during re-opening of classes.

5. Irregular attendance insubordination to teachers, habitual inattention to school work, obscenity in word or act will be considered as grave reason for suspending/dismissing a pupil.
6. The school does not hold itself responsible for the pupil's conduct outside its premises. It, however, takes cognizance of any serious misconduct of its pupils committed outside its precincts and should any serious charge be fairly substantiated, the guilty shall be punished according to the gravity of the offence.
7. Progress Records will be issued after the Semester Examination. They shall be returned to the class teacher duly signed by the parents or guardian within 3 days of their issue.
8.
 - a) Pupils should on all days wear the prescribed School Uniform which is modest and becoming of school children.
 - b) The prescribed footwear from Monday to Saturday is black shoes with blue socks. However black rainy shoes without socks are allowed during the rainy season from June to September.
 - c) It is mandatory to wear the prescribed school uniform regularly by the students. Any additional like the scarf, burqua, shawl and other objectionable gear are not permitted to be worn with the uniform in the school campus.
 - d) Students are not permitted either individually or in group to hold activities of worship other than those organized by the school authority within the campus.
 - e) Staff and Students are requested to speak in English in the school.
 - f) Boys should wear the belt supplied by the school
9. Every pupil must respect to the members of staff and salute them on meeting them for the first time during the day.
10. Books, magazines, newspapers etc., not approved by the Principal should not be brought to the school.
11. Books, umbrellas, raincoats, stationary, tiffin's, etc., should have a name or mark by which the owner can easily be known and all stray or unclaimed property should be brought to the Principals' office.

12. **No student or staff member will be called to the phone during the school hours, In case of urgency, however messages received on the phone will be conveyed to them. Use of mobile is strictly prohibited during working hours except lunch time and after 4.15p.m. onwards.**
13. Pupils must not join any clubs or societies or make any engagements that would interfere with their studies.
14. Catholic pupils are advised to go to confession at least once a month and every day for mass, if possible.
15. When prayers are said at the beginning and at the end of class, everyone should stand and pray respectfully.
16. Any letters from students or parents addressed to the Principal should be sent along with postage paid envelope for reply.
17. No subscriptions are allowed without the previous permission of the Principal.
18. Pupils should adhere to the discipline of the school wholeheartedly. They should follow the bells scrupulously, particularly bells given after the recess time. They should never leave the school premises in between intervals.
19. Running, playing or shouting inside the school building is not allowed. No student is permitted to enter any class room other than her/his own without permission.
20. Any kind of damage done in the school premises will have to be made good.
21. Those who wish to have lunch in the school are requested to pay the amount of 600/- per month.

SCHOLASTIC ASSESSMENT

1. The students who absent themselves from any Term examination for valid reason should get prior permission from the head of the Institution. In case of illness a medical certificate should be submitted. Therefore, any absence from examination without permission will be viewed seriously and suitable action will be taken.
2. a) The students who pass in all the subjects in all the three examinations during the year scoring 90% marks in Std I to VII in each subject in the aggregate will be awarded merit certificates.
b) Pupils who score below Grade B in Religion/Value Education will be considered as failure.

3. Every student should put in at least 75% attendance in order to merit promotion to the higher class.
4. Malpractice in examinations is a serious offence and, therefore, will not be tolerated. The students who have recourse to malpractice in any examinations will not be promoted to higher class.

RECOMMENDATION TO PARENTS / GUARDIANS

1. Parents play a decisive role in the development of students in their formative years. Therefore, the school expects the whole-hearted cooperation of the parents.
2. a) Parents are requested to cooperate with the school authorities by enforcing Regularity and Discipline, by advising and guiding their children to study their lessons daily and to take an active and salutary interest in the activities of the school.
b) Pupils who come to school without completing their daily work will be kept back after class to complete their work.
3. a) Parents and Guardians are recommended to call at the Principal's Office between 11:00 a.m. to 12p.m. and 3 p.m. to 4 p.m. and on appointed days to ascertain from the school authorities the conduct and progress of the students under their charge.
b) Parents are requested not to enter the classrooms and see individual teachers during class hours except on the Parents Meet Day / second Saturdays.
4. Parents are advised not to give any pocket money to the children while coming to school.
5. Parents should encourage their child to take a full share in the co-curricular activities and must regularly attend crafts, fine arts, physical training and games classes.
6. a) Private Tuition are not encouraged. Private tutors may not be engaged except after consulting the Principal with her consent.
b) If parents arrange private tuitions for their wards with the teacher of our Institution, such students will be forced to withdraw their children from school.

1. Parents are requested to see that their children do not come to school wearing gold bangles, chains, finger rings, showy earrings or any other costly ornaments.
2. Parents /Guardians are advised not to give any gifts to the teachers.
3. Total number of working days for the year will be 228 or more.
